

The Black Subset Achievement Plant BSAP was approved by the Los Angeles United Board of Education in February of the 2000-2002 closely was Funding Black board and a second of the Subset Black Black

The BSAP addresses the need for culturally responsive curriculum and instruction as the classroom norm, fosters partnerships with community based organizations with provine track records of success within the Black community, and provides increased staffing support to address the scalemic and social-emporant needs of Black students.
